

DEFINITIONS

12-MONTH TRAILING TURNOVER: A measure of trading activity in a fund's portfolio over the past 12 months expressed as a percentage of the fund's average total assets. ACTIVE SHARE: Represents the proportion of portfolio holdings that differ from those in the benchmark index. ALPHA: Measures the difference between the Fund's actual returns and its benchmark, given its level of risk as measured by beta. The difference is expressed as an annual percentage. BETA: . Measures the volatility of the fund, as compared to that of the overall market. MAXIMUM DRAWDOWN: Measures the largest single drop from peak to trough in the value of a portfolio (before a new peak is achieved). UPSIDE CAPTURE RATIO: Measures a fund's performance versus a benchmark during periods where the benchmark had a positive return. DOWNSIDE CAPTURE RATIO: Measures a fund's performance versus a benchmark during periods where the benchmark had a negative return. STANDARD DEVIATION: A statistical measure of portfolio risk used to measure variability of total return around an average, over a specified period of time. The greater the standard deviation over the period, the wider the variability or range of returns and hence, the greater the fund's volatility. $\mbox{\sc R-SQUARED}$: Measures the percentage of a fund's returns that can be explained by the returns of the benchmark. SHARPE RATIO: Is calculated by subtracting the risk-free rate, such as that of the 10-year U.S. Treasury bond from the rate of return for a portfolio and dividing the result by the standard deviation of the portfolio returns.


